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Routines and Expectations

6. School Attendance

Students must **attend school daily.** They should not miss any lessons and activities conducted during or after curriculum time. Any request to extend holidays will not be granted and it will be recorded as "Absence without Valid Reason(s)". Hence, we seek your understanding and fullest support in this matter and appeal to **parents/guardians not to take your child/ward out of school without valid reasons**.

If your child/ward is absent from school, a **medical certificate** or a letter of excuse is to be promptly submitted to the Form Teacher upon his/her return to school. A valid* medical certificate must be produced by students who misses any scheduled school examinations, tests or other forms of graded assessment, failing which, a zero mark will be recorded. *(*medical certificates from TCM are not valid for absence from tests and examinations)*

If your child/ward is going to be absent from school for three or more days, please contact the Form Teacher to make arrangements regarding schoolwork.

7. School Bags

Please be reminded that **trolley bags** are <u>not</u> allowed for school use as they are too heavy for primary school children. Your child should a bag of lightweight material. The recommended total weight of a school bag should be less than 4 kg, or 10- 15% of the child's weight. Please guide your child/ward in the labelling of his/her belongings and packing of his/her school bag.

8. Headphones

For hygiene reasons, students are expected to use their personal headphones for computer-based lessons. Please label your child's/ward's headphone for identification purpose and remind him/her to take good care of it.

9. Healthy Meals in Schools Programme (HMSP)

Since 2014, our school has partnered the Health Promotion Board in implementing the **HMSP** as we believe in educating our students about healthy eating and good dietary habits. The canteen vendors prepare well-balanced and nutritious meals. Each meal comes with a good mix of food groups recommended by "My Healthy Plate", a guide for balanced and healthy meals. The food costs \$1.20, \$1.50 and \$1.80 for small, medium and large servings respectively.



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10. Snack Break

For the well-being of our students, we are implementing snack break during lesson time, in addition to recess break. During the snack break, students are allowed to consume finger food (e.g. biscuits, muffins, sandwiches, fruits). Parents/Guardians are strongly encouraged to prepare healthier snacks for their children/wards to eat during the short break.

Safety and Security

11. Hygiene and Health Matters

Please check that your child/ward is well daily before he comes to school. Students who are unwell especially with Acute Respiratory Infection (ARI) symptoms including runny nose, sore throat, flu, cough and/or fever, and/or diagnosed with infectious diseases or symptoms such as Hand-Foot-and-Mouth disease (HFMD), red eye (conjunctivitis) etc are to remain at home to recuperate and should return to school only when he/she has completely recovered.

12. Daily Temperature-Taking

Daily temperature checking will be conducted once a day. It is important for your child/ward to have his/her own Oral Digital Thermometer (ODT) and we will require your assistance to ensure the ODT remains in good working condition.

13. Safe Management Measures

- Wearing of Face Masks and Face Shields
 All students are to put on their face masks but maybe allowed to wear their face shields during lesson time. Please ensure he/she has at least one spare mask in his/her mask box at all times.
- Wipe Down Routines As part of Safe Management Measures (SMM), we will continue to enforce wipe down routines.

14. Safety and Security Matters

- Visitors (including parents and guardians) are only allowed into the school premises if they:
 - o need to pick up their children/ward home early (before dismissal time);
 - have an appointment with the Principal, Vice-Principal and/or teachers;
 - \circ need to make enquiry or conduct administration at the General Office.
- Visitors must report to the Security Guard at Gate 2 to obtain a 'Visitor Pass' before proceeding to General Office. Visitors should not enter the school through Gates 1, 3 and 4. The Teaching Blocks and Canteen are out-of-bounds to all visitors.
- Students should learn to be responsible for their own things. Parents/Guardians should not deliver their child's/ward's personal items (e.g. pocket money, books, stationery, water bottle and food) through the General Office and security post.
- Students must nor bring excessive amount of money to school and should learn to spend wisely.
 Parents/guardians can teach budgeting habits to their child/ward.



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- Students are <u>not</u> allowed to bring expensive personal belongings, such as electronic games, tablets, iPads, handphones, to school. The school will <u>not</u> be held accountable for any loss and/or damage of these items.
- Should any student require early dismissal, parents/guardians are to pick him/her at the General Office. This is to ensure our students leave the school under proper supervision.
- We appeal to all parents/guardians to demonstrate good road safety habits by using the pedestrian crossing when crossing the road in front of our school gates.

Partners in Education

15. School-Home Partnership

We welcome parents/guardians to be our partners in education by:

- ensuring that your child/ward attends school punctually everyday
- informing teachers of your child's/ward's medical conditions and allergies (if any)
- informing teachers of changes in contact numbers and address
- contacting teachers to discuss matters concerning your child/ward
- meeting your child/ward at the gate during dismissal times
- directing any matters relating to student discipline to your child's/ward's teacher for follow-up actions, where necessary and appropriate

You may also approach the Yead Heads, if the teachers are not available.
